Schuknecht and Miller Claim Junior National Championships

Jacob Schuknecht from the Chesley LBC in Ontario beat Saskatchewan's Grant Wilkie (Nutana LBC) 21 - 8 to win the 2010 National Junior Bowls Championship at the Fairmount Lawn Bowling Club in London Ontario. Schuknecht lost to Wilkie in the round robin but beat him the final. In the bronze medal match Ontario's Dylan Jacobs from the host club Fairmount beat Nova Scotia's Cameron Lefresne (Bedford LBC) 21 - 6 to claim the bronze medal.

Stephanie Miller from the Brighton LBC in Ontario beat Nova Scotia's Lindsay Lefresne (Bedford LBC) 21 - 12. In the bronze medal match Ontario's Kaitlin Ryan (Kitchener LBC) beat British Columbia's Jaymee Sidel 21 - 6 to claim the bronze medal.

Pituley and McKerihen take World Junior Cup Selection

Jonathan Pituley from the Regina LBC (SK) beat returning champion Dylan Jacobs from the Kitchener LBC (ON) 2 - 1 to win the 2010 World Junior Cup Selection. Jonathan Pituley got the best of Jacobs in this year's tournament beating him both in the round robin and in the gold medal match. In the men's bronze medal match Ontario's Trevor Whyte beat fellow Ontario native Kody Olthof 2 - 1 to claim the bronze medal.

In the Women's competition Kelly McKerihen (ON) beat Saskatchewan's Fran Scott 3 - 0 to win the gold medal. Kelly McKerihen bowled over the competition at this year's World Junior Cup Selection shutting out her opposition in every game that she bowled. In the bronze medal match Nova Scotia's Lindsay Lefresne beat Ontario's Stephanie Miller 2 - 1 to claim the bronze medal.

Jonathan Pituley and Kelly McKerihen earned the right to represent Canada at the 2011 World Junior Cup in Warilla, Australia in April 2011. This event is World Bowls Indoor Championships for juniors as defined by those over 18 and under 26 as of December 2010.

The silver medal winners – Fran Scott and Dylan Jacobs will head to England in October to compete in the 2010 World Bowls Indoor Bowls Council's Gents and Ladies Singles Championships and Mixed Pairs Championships.

For those of you not familiar with the World Junior Cup Selection the event is used to determine Canada's male and female junior representative to the World Junior Cup hosted by World Bowls. Play in the World Junior Selection and World Bowls World Junior Cup is set play. Competitors play matches consisting of two sets played over 9 ends. The winner of each set will be the player with the most shots at the completion of the 9th end.
